

Objectives of the Game:

- Students will learn the principles of Team Work in a fun environment
- Students will make friends and connect with the school
- Students will learn and practice Arabic throughout the game
- Students will learn the Islamic Values and related Zikr throughout the game.
- Students will have fun memories to remember throughout their life

Rules of the Game:

- The game consists of eight or more teams. Each team will have 4 or 5 students from different levels. Choice of students will be based on a fair and transparent draw
- Teams will prepare a small paragraph in Arabic to present themselves and show how they think they can win ... video shots and pictures will be taken for each team.
- Teams will be disclosed early to allow students to do a good presentation and know their strengths and weaknesses.
- The lead for each team will be from the Arabic class (see roles of the Lead Student). One Shahid will accompany each team for the full time of the game (see roles of Al-Shahid)
- Teams will compete for the same clues and challenges, not necessarily at the same time to avoid bottlenecks.
- Teams will have access to the same resources and will have to pass eight challenges.
- Teams will respect all members of the teams as well as other teams and will show positive attitude throughout the game.
- Start and end points will be in the park area behind the school
- Pictures and video shots will be taken throughout the game.

Roles of Al-Shahid:

Their job will be to witness the players completing challenges, make sure the rules of each challenge are being followed, and driving the whole team to the different pit stops if car is required. They are also responsible for giving out the new clue after each challenge is completed, and passing out the new challenge envelopes. They will take photos and video shots for various moments in the game. The witness must be unbiased and must not provide help, advice, or even hints to their team whatsoever. They would only speak to the team in Arabic language.

Roles of Lead Student:

- The lead student will ensure that all team members are engaged equally in the game and will not allow team members to blame or disrespect each other.
- The lead student will resolve any conflict during the game. If there is a tie regards the way forward, the lead student will take the final decision.
- The lead student will ensure that the Arabic language is used to understand and search for the clues.
- The lead student will ensure that the team do cleanup after each challenge and return all resources at the end of the game.

Presentation by Students:

Students will present their team name and how they fit together to make a wonderful team. They will discuss what others might think of their weakness and how they see themselves. They will also present how they are leveraging the strengths of each other and what position they think they will reach. They will need to present with a funny humor and self confidence. Highlights of their speech will be recorded in Arabic and English for future videos. Prizes will be handed out to the best presentation even if the team is not the winner. Extra prizes will be provided for flash phrases or flash ideas.
